DEL RIO RAMS: Head football coach Frenchey McCrea returns the services of 4 offensive and 6 defensive starters back from a team that finished with an impressive overall season record of 10-2 and a district co-championship mark of 6-1.

Offensively the 2017 Rams will be relatively young on the offensive side of the ball with prospect Larry Galindo to be counted on to take over the signal calling duties and fellow prospects Devin Brown and Eddie Garcia expected to share the running back duties. Dizan Rodriguez will help pave the way on the offensive line for the Rams power rushing attack.

On the defensive side of the ball the Rams will be solid featuring a pair of hard hitting linebackers Manny Arguijo and Jaden Bocanegra. SOUTH SAN BOBCATS: Head football coach Ron Kretz will have 8 offensive and 7 defensive starters back from a squad that culminated last season with an overall record of 0-10 and a district mark of 0-7.

Offensively the Bobcats will feature Raul Agosto who rushed for over 1000 yards last year and could possibly take over the quarterback duties. Wide Receiver James Valencia who had nearly 500 yards receiving and ran for over 450 yards will be the favorite target in their passing game.
